4. FIRST AID MEASURES

Inhalation: Move to fresh air. If breathing is difficult, give oxygen. If not breathing, give

artificial respiration. If symptoms develop and persist, get medical attention.

Skin contact: Molten adhesive may cause severe burns. Cool melted product on skin with

plenty of water. Do not remove solidified product. No attempt should be made to remove material from skin or to remove contaminated clothing as damaged skin can be easily torn. Cover affected areas with clean sheeting or gauze and

seek immediate medical attention.

Eye contact: If eye contact occurs with molten material immediately cool with water. Do not

remove adhesive. Seek medical attention.

Ingestion: Ingestion of solid adhesive is not expected to be hazardous. If symptoms

develop and persist, get medical attention.

5. FIRE FIGHTING MEASURES

6. ACCIDENTAL RELEASE MEASURES

7. HANDLING AND STORAGE

resins. Follow suggested application temperature. Do not wear contact lenses. At elevated temperatures, irritating fumes may be emitted. Provide adequate ventilation. Wash hands before breaks and immediately after handling the

product.

Storage: For safe storage, store between 0.0 °C (32°F) and 38.0 °C (100.4 °F)
